Greetings to you on the first ever Digital Campus Ministry Sunday!



Let us live now in hope.



Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

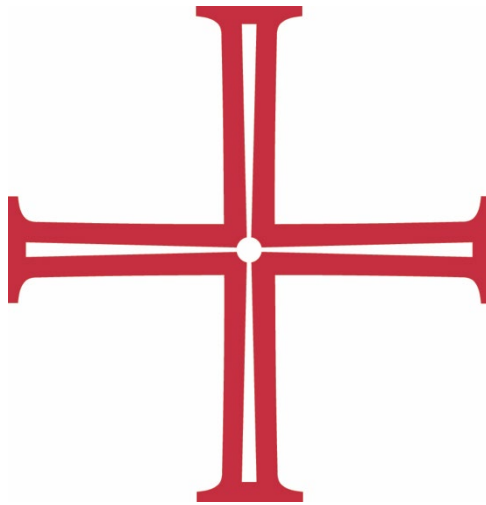

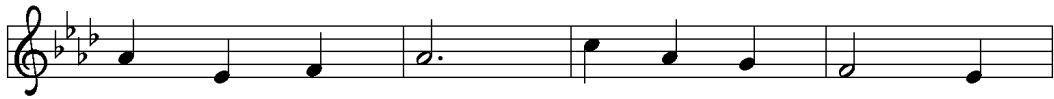
